Dr Dan Fleming

Where do I stand, and why do I stand there? Our faith calls on us to be witnesses to God's love, but what does that mean today? In this presentation Dr Dan Fleming will explore ethics in the Catholic tradition – focusing on dignity and flourishing. He will focus particularly on how our ethical tradition grapples with ethical questions at the end of life, which are relevant in our Queensland context. In this, Dan will draw on his experience as Chair of Catholic Health Australia's 'Response to Voluntary Assisted Dying' Taskforce.

Dr Dan Fleming is Group Manager – Ethics and Formation for St Vincent's Health Australia, a role which sees him leading ethics education, advice and strategy as well as supporting formation across the St Vincent's Health Australia network. He chaired the Catholic

Dan is also a Fellow in the Law, Health and Justice Research Centre in the Faculty of Law at the University of Technology Sydney, a Senior Lecturer in Theology and Ethics with the Sydney College of Divinity, and an Adjunct Lecturer for the Institute of Ethics and Society at the University of Notre Dame, Australia. He is a member of the international advisory board for the British Journal of Religious Education and 'Asian Theological Ethics', a book series published by Catholic Theological Ethics in the World Church.

Dan holds a PhD in moral philosophy and theology and is the author of over 35 publications in the areas of moral philosophy, theological ethics, moral education, religious education and theology. His most recent publication is *Attentiveness to Vulnerability*, a book which engages in dialogue between moral philosophy, natural law theory and virtue ethics in the Catholic tradition.
