THE NATIONAL CATHOLIC SAFEGUARDING STANDARDS (MAY 2019):

- Committed leadership, governance and culture: Child safeguarding is embedded in diocesan leadership, governance and culture
 - management: Processes for raising concerns and complaints are responsive, understood, accessible and used by children, families, carers, communities and personnel
- Children are safe, informed and participate: Children are informed about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously
- Ongoing education and training: Personnel are equipped with knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children safe through information, ongoing education and training

Effective complaints

- Partnering with families, carers and communities: Families, carers and communities are informed and involved in promoting child safeguarding
- Safe physical and online environments: Physical and online environments promote safety and contain appropriate safeguards to minimize the opportunity for children to be harmed
- Equity is promoted and diversity is respected: Equity is upheld and diverse needs respected on policy and practice
- improvement: The Diocese regularly reviews and improves implementation of systems for keeping children safe

- Robust human resource management:
 - People working with children are suitable and supported to reflect child safeguarding values in practice
